ELECTION ADDRESS - Sophie Fletcher, MNCH(Reg)

I joined the NCH when I first trained as a Hypnotherapist and have now been in practice for over 3 years, prior to that I worked as policy advisor in economic development and business growth. After successfully applying to the post of Executive Director late last year I was co-opted onto the board in early January with responsibility for Membership Services. ELECTION ADDRESS - Trevor Silvester, FNCH

I've been a member of the NCH committee now for approximately 10 years, firstly as the editor of the Journal, then latterly the FAB member, Ethics Director and at present the Supervision Director. I see my present task as developing a supervision course the NCH can offer to trainers that fits the needs of the membership, and integrating the role of the supervisor more fully into the development of new members so that meaningful development becomes a true cornerstone of professional dvelopment. ELECTION ADDRESS – Donald Robertson, MNCH(Acc) Senior Clinician

I've been co-opted into the role as research director since early 2009, despite having to temporarily stand down for about 6 months, for reasons outside of my control, I've been quite busy... Some of you may know that I edited the collected writings of James Braid for publication by NCH. All of the profit from that book goes to NCH for the benefit of its members and you'll find NCH mentioned all over the internet as the publisher (free publicity!). I also negotiated a deal whereby NCH got free advertising in the Changes catalogue in exchange for distributing this to members. I developed proposals for a possible "research division" of NCH. I ran the NCH Facebook page until we reached over 1,000 followers, at which point I decided to pass on the responsibility. I spent several months revising the HPD (Version 2) to improve the standard of training and make it easier for more schools to deliver (published in the journal). I've also developed proposals for an NCFE Level 5 "Advanced Diploma" award in hypnotherapy. I helped developed proposals for revision of the supervision award. I'm the author of many articles in the NCH journal and I've been posting detailed summaries of research evidence for NCH, including online guidance on searching for hypnosis research and a summary of key studies on empirically-supported applications of hypnotherapy. As well as running one of the largest hypnotherapy training schools in the UK, I've been involved in the Coping With

Noise programme of research for about four years now, with a team of colleagues, conducting studies for a Government dept. on the benefits of hypnosis and CBT for noise-related stress – so I've got some first-hand experience as a published researcher (proper peer-reviewed research). In addition to NCH's The Discovery of Hypnosis: The Complete Writings of James Braid, I'm also the author of the forthcoming books "The Philosophy of CBT" and "The Practice of Cognitive-Behavioural Hypnotherapy" (published by Karnac) – so I'm very actively involved in the field of therapy. I've spoken at your conference three times and hope to do so again sometime soon.
